Judy Baker, one of ClubPet's founders, shares with us a humorous story about her dog, Heidi, and how she was outwitted by this four-legged

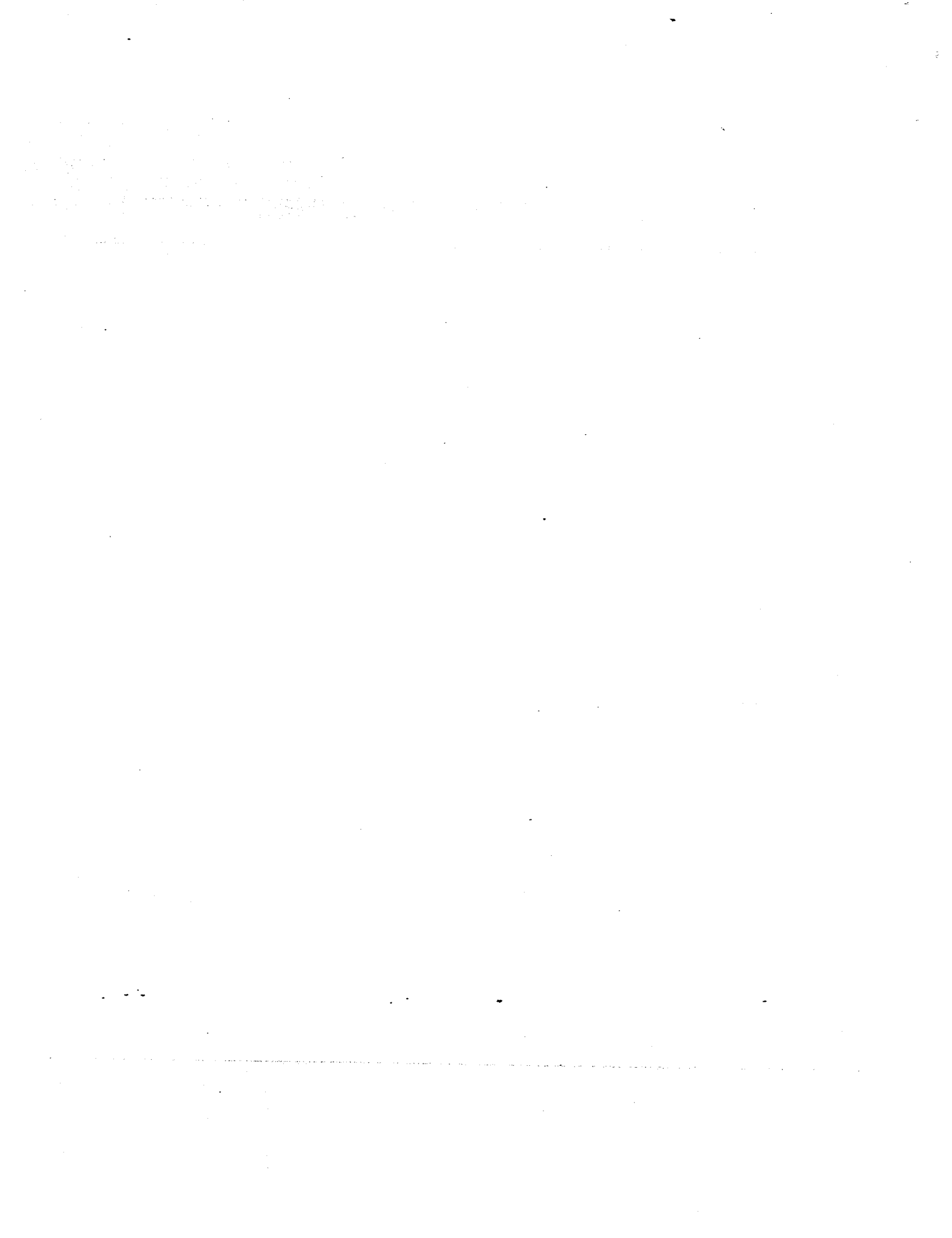
