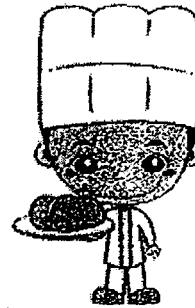

In August 1972, an emergency call came over the radio for Jacob's firefighting crew to handle a small fire that had broken out. By the time Jacob arrived at the scene, most of the residents had already made it out of the blazing seven-storey inferno.

5 Jacob and his partners hurriedly entered the building to ensure that everyone had made it out of the building. The fire on the fifth floor was raging and it was too dangerous for anyone to enter it. Ground personnel were ensuring that the residents were evacuated and accounted for. They radioed the firefighters to evacuate. As Jacob and his colleagues came out of the front of the building, a young, frantic woman came running up to them yelling, "Where is my Kris?"

10 The woman who lived in Apartment 529 explained that she had left her 7-year-old son, Kris, in her home while she went to buy some groceries. Ground personnel could not account for Kris anywhere. Jacob and another firefighter made their way back up to the fifth floor. Apartment 529 was engulfed in flames at the other end of the hall, and most of the floor was already impassable. "My partner looked at me and gave me the thumbs-down," said Jacob. 15 "As a fireman, I knew he was right. The chances of us surviving if we went down that hall were slim, let alone finding that boy. However, I kept seeing the mother's face in my head. I could not give up on this."

20 Impulsively, Jacob darted down the hall without his partner, disappearing into the flames. As flames shot out of the apartment like fireballs, he could see a little boy lying on the floor in the only spot that was not on fire. Jacob grabbed him and rushed out. They cleared the fifth floor landing just as they heard the sound of the floor above crumbling.

The tense crowd below broke into cheers as they saw Jacob emerge from the building with the boy. With Kris pressed up against his chest, Jacob could feel the boy's heart pounding, and when he coughed from the smoke, Jacob knew Kris would survive.

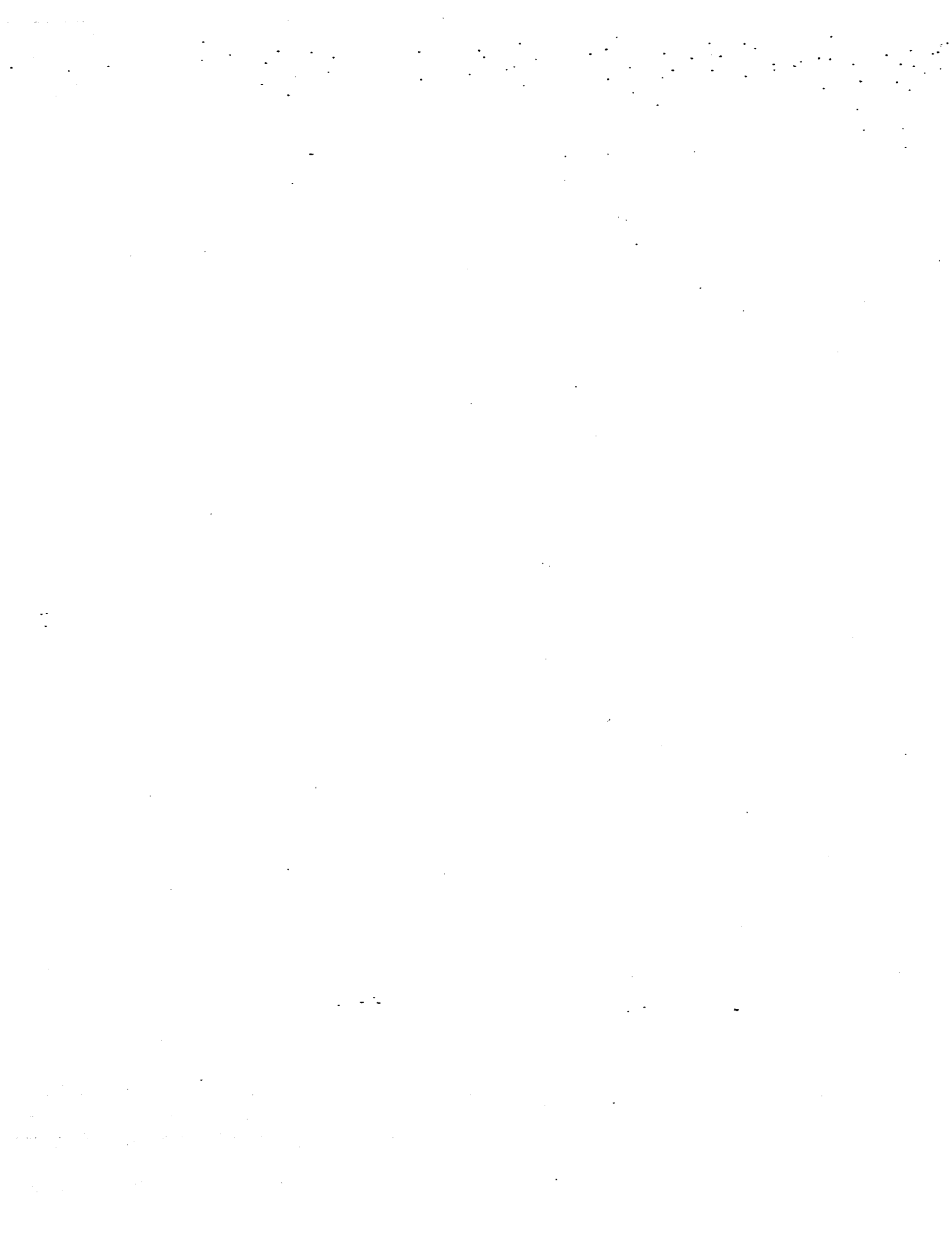
