The boat will only leave when there are 12 passengers.

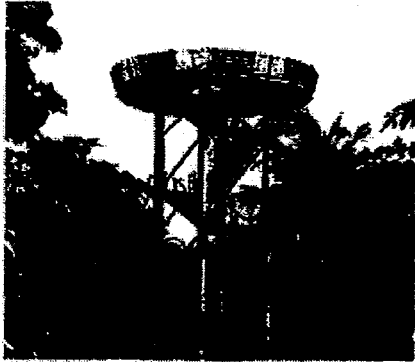

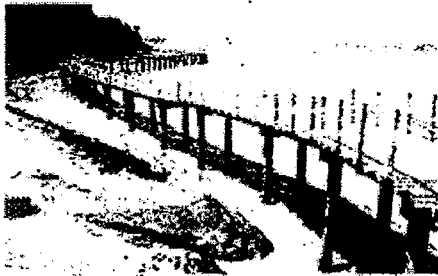

Attraction 1: Tanjong Chek Jawa

At the southeast of the island lies "*Tanjong Chek Jawa*" which was saved from reclamation due to public outcry. *Tanjong Chek Jawa* is rich in marine life, such as sand dollars, starfish, sea hares, cuttlefish and sponges, which is rarely seen on the main island. Viewers can view *Tanjong Chek Jawa* either from the *Jejewi Tower* or the *Broadwalk* that allows close up views of the marine life.

Guided Tours:

- Book in advance by calling the visitor centre's hotline: 65424108.
- It is open to all ages, however, children under the age of 12 must be under guardian or parental guidance.
- A fee of \$8 per person to be paid directly to the guide during the tour.
- All participants must wear covered footwear.

Attraction 2: Sensory Trail

Experience Ubin's wonderful nature through your different senses along the "*Sensory Trail*" which is easy-going and takes about 2 hours to complete.

Visitors will be accompanied by a nature guide to touch, see, and smell fruit trees, herbs and spices, plants used in medicine and native plants of the mangrove forest.



Attraction 3: Ketam Mountain Bike Park

For adrenaline junkies, this park has over a dozen trails of varying difficulty, featuring a series of steep climbs, sharp corners and demanding obstacles. Come and put your skills to test!

The other students ran to the wall and searched for their names on the list, jumping up and down to look over other people's heads. Then, some screamed in excitement while some slied away angrily. 5

Following the success of my audition, I was placed in the orchestra. I was in the middle of the violin section. However, I was too short to see the conductor as I was blocked by an eleven-year-old boy in front of me. "Hey, Gordon. Switch seats with Mandy," the conductor called, "she cannot see over you." 10

I learned that the world of orchestra was a hierarchical one. The assignment of seats from first row to last row of chairs was based on one's capability. If you were seated in the front near the conductor, you had to be excellent; if you were seated at the back, you were considered just mediocre. The shame being in the rear of the section was demoralising. I understood the gravity of the seating arrangement. 15

Upon hearing the conductor's words, Gordon looked stricken. "Everyone will think she had done better than me in the audition!" he burst. During the break, I heard him tell his friends, "I'm going to challenge her. Then, the conductor would have to return me my seat." After which, Gordon explained to me that we would both perform an excerpt from the orchestra music, alone in front of the group. Whoever played it better would win. I had no choice but to agree. 20

When we returned to class, Gordon wasted no time in bringing up his idea to the conductor. The conductor agreed and the challenge was scheduled for the following day. After class, seeing my father across the room, I ran up to him and flung myself into his arms. "Daddy! A boy challenged me! That boy over there!" I pointed. I waited for my father's sympathetic hug. I waited for him to tell me that he would not let any boy pick on me. Instead, he grabbed a music stand and set it up right in the corner of the room. Then, he told me to start practising. 25

For fifteen minutes, my father watched over my shoulder as I worked on the piece, barking orders. "Faster!" "Posture!" "Watch your rhythm!" Then, he sent me off, "There, now you just go out there and play like that. May the best man win." I gave my father a wink, feeling optimistic about the challenge. 30

Maybe I should have expected as much. When we played chess, my father always won. Years ago, my father said if he had eased up and let me win, that would be cheating. It was the first lesson I remembered from my father: Work hard and do not be afraid of losing. If you do lose, pick yourself up and try harder the next time. 35

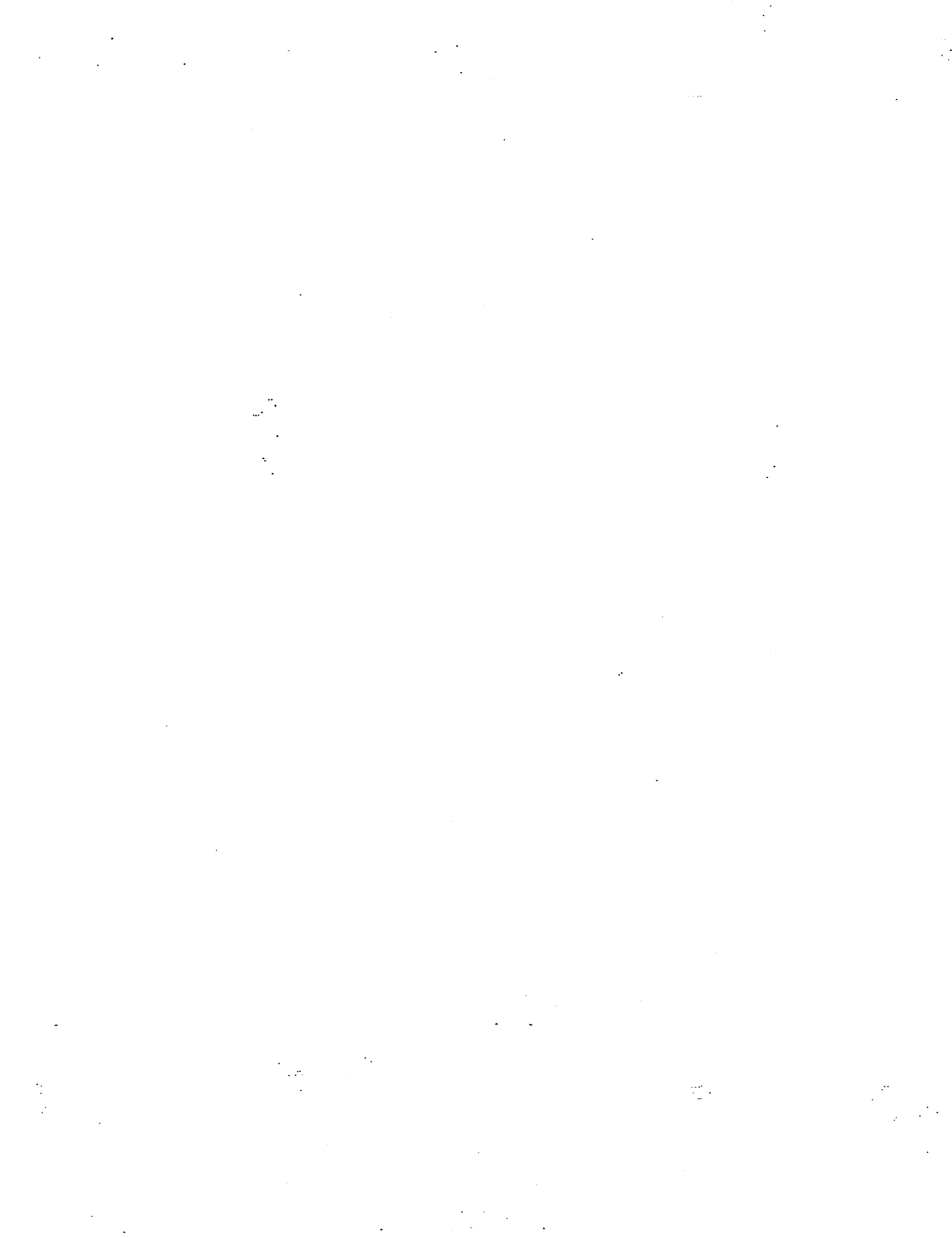
